Job Description

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The Instructor teaches scouting skills. They will work closely with both the Troop Guide and Assistant Scoutmasters. The Instructor does not have to be an expert but should be able to have the basic understanding and ability to seamlessly teach the scoutcraft skills needed for Tenderfoot, Second Class, and First Class ranks. Instructors help all scouts feel comfortable and guide them thru the requirements.

- Be on time for meetings and activities
- Prepare well in advance for each teaching assignment
- Teach basic scouting skills in troop and patrols
- Serve as a member of the Patrol Leader's Council
- Help scouts earn advancement requirements
- Assist the Assistant Scoutmasters with training
- Attend ILST training (even if you have attended in the past)

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS:

- Attend a majority of troop meetings (3 out of 4 monthly) and Court of Honors (3 out of 4 annually)
- Attend a majority of PLC quarterly meetings, PLC training sessions and annual planning meeting
- Attend half of all troop campouts (6 out of 12 annually)
- Check and respond to troop emails/correspondence on a consistent basis
- Set a good example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law
- Show and helps develop Scout spirit within the Troop
- Wear the Scout uniform correctly
