Job Description

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

The OA Representative is the youth liaison between the local OA lodge or chapter and the troop. They will be responsible for regularly attending OA meetings as well as Troop meetings.

- Be on time for meetings and activities
- Serves as a communication link between the OA lodge/chapter and the troop
- Encourage year round and resident camping in the troop
- Encourage scouts to actively participate in community service projects
- Encourage older scout participation in high adventure activities
- Encourage Arrowmen in troop to be active in their local OA activities
- Encourage Arrowmen in troop to seal their membership in the Order by becoming Brotherhood/Vigil members

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS:

- Attend a majority of all troop meetings (3 out of 4 monthly)
- Attend a majority of OA meetings (7 out of 12 annually)
- Attend a majority of Court of Honors (3 out of 4 annually)
- Attend half of all troop campouts (6 out of 12 annually)
- Check and respond to troop emails/correspondence on a consistent basis
- Set a good example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law
- Show and helps develop Scout spirit within the Troop
- Wear the Scout uniform correctly
