Job Description

ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Patrol Quartermasters serve as the patrol's supply boss. They keep an inventory of patrol chuck boxes and see that the gear is in good condition. They work under the troop quartermaster as they are expected to maintain uniformity between all of the patrols' chuck boxes. Patrol Quartermasters will check out the equipment needed for patrol functions from the Troop Quartermaster and return it upon completion. They report to the Troop Quartermaster on the status of equipment in need of replacement or repair. In carrying out their responsibilities, they may have the guidance of a member of the troop committee.

- keeps records on patrol equipment and chuck boxes
- makes sure the patrol equipment is in good working condition
- checks out equipment and makes sure it is returned in good condition
- makes suggestions for new or replacement items
- works with the troop committee member responsible for equipment

QUALIFICATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS

- Attend a majority of troop meetings (3 out of 4 monthly) and Court of Honors (3 out of 4 annually)
- Attend a half of all troop campouts (6 out of 12 annually)
- Check and respond to troop emails/correspondence on a consistent basis
- Set a good example by living the Scout Oath and Law in your everyday life
- Live by the Scout Oath and Law
- Show and help develop Scout spirit within the Troop
- Wear the Scout uniform correctly
